Schenectady City School District coordinates and integrates Contract for Excellence programs with other educational services for all students and teachers. The initiatives supported through IDEA, Title I, School Improvement, and other funding sources (Title IIA, IID, III, IV, 21st Century, Elementary School Counselors', Safe Schools Healthy Students, Learning Technology Grant, Teachers of Tomorrow, and Extended day Violence Prevention) have been conscientiously coordinated to insure that there is a seamless integration and alignment to support the Comprehensive Education Plans and improvement efforts at the district level as well as at the building level. The services are available to general ed. Students, Students with disabilities, ESL students, and homeless children, and youth. The services include:

- ζ Academic Intervention Services;
 - ζ Remedial Reading;
 - ζ Remedial Math;
 - ζ Extended Day Programs;
 - ζ English as a Second Language Services;
 - ζ Special Education Services;
 - ζ Head Start, Even Start, and preschool programs administered by the LEA;
 - ζ Referrals to health, mental health, dental, and other appropriate services; and
 - ζ Assistance for unaccompanied youth and placement decisions, including the wishes in those decisions and providing notice to youth of the right to appeal such decisions.
- The services are coordinated through Child Study Team meetings, which are held at each of the buildings on a weekly basis.
