- ◆ Outstanding multi-sport athlete at MPHS; a pioneer in girls' athletics in the SCSD
- ◆ Highly respected coach at Saratoga HS (Boys' & Girls' Volleyball, Girls' Basketball, Boys' & Girls' Bowling, Field Hockey and Boys' Golf)
- ◆ Won Section II & Regional Class A Softball Titles in 1994 & 2000; reached Sectional finals in 1995-99
- ◆ 2014 Times Union Golf Coach of the Year

Ken Johnson

- ◆ Lettered in football, basketball, baseball & track at Nott Terrace HS
- ◆ Lettered in baseball at Syracuse U (1949-51)
- ◆ Played baseball in the Brooklyn Dodgers organization
- ◆ Coached basketball at St. Columba's HS; won 2 NYS Small Catholic School championships
- ◆ SCSD Chair for P.E. & Interscholastic Athletics
- ◆ 1989 inductee into the Sch'dy Baseball Hall of Fame

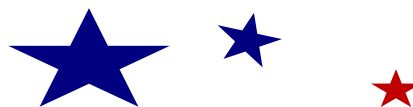

Rick DiCamillo

- ◆ Graduated from Mont Pleasant HS in 1954
- ◆ Ran cross-country & track for Ray Vacca
- ◆ 1952 Class "A" Sectional Cross-Country champion; finished 6th in 1952 NYSPHSAA meet
- ◆ Individual winner of 1953 Grout Run w/meet record; also won 1953 cross-country meets – Proctor Invitational, Fordham University's Eastern Interscholastic Championships, St. John's Interscholastic Run & NYU Interscholastic Run
- ◆ 1953 Class "A" Sectional Cross-Country winner
- ◆ Runner-up in 1953 NYSPHSAA Intersectional Cross-Country Meet (eclipsed prev. meet rec.)
- ◆ Won the mile run in 1954 at Utica Invitational (meet record) & Sch'dy Sports Carnival
- ◆ Undefeated in the mile as a senior
- ◆ 1954 NYS one mile champion (NYSPHSAA record 4:23.6)
- ◆ 1954 Ran 2nd fastest scholastic mile in nation
- ◆ 1954 Sch'dy Trackman of the Year (Junior Chamber of Commerce)
- ◆ 1954 All-America High School Track Team (Scholastic Coach)
- ◆ Runner-up to the Sch'dy Little League World Championship team for Sch'dy Athlete of Year
- ◆ Won the 1954 Norman E. Kitching Award
- ◆ Awarded a scholarship to the University of Notre Dame; also recruited by Kansas, Syracuse, Manhattan, Yale & Brown
- ◆ Set record for the Notre Dame freshman three-mile course (14:57)
- ◆ Ran outstanding leg on ND distance medley relay team at the 47th annual Drake Relays (2nd Place)
- ◆ Won the 1957 Central Collegiate Conference indoor mile (meet record—4:11.1); 6th fastest collegiate indoor mile that year
- ◆ Finished 5th in the college mile at the 1958 IC4A meet at Madison Square Garden
- ◆ Won individual events in dual meets vs. Pitt, Purdue, Indiana, Marquette & Missouri
- ◆ Had distinguished 20-year career in the Air Force; awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross in 1969; awarded 8 USAF Air Medals for missions in Vietnam; retired as a Lt. Colonel; later worked at the Pentagon & served on two Presidential Base Closure Commissions

Tom Mossey

- ◆ Graduated from Nott Terrace HS in 1956
- ◆ Played on 3 varsity basketball teams at NT for Athletic Hall of Fame member Walt Przybylo
- ◆ Elevated to varsity as a sophomore; NT finished 16-4 & won Class "A" League, Sectionals & Intersectionals (1954)
- ◆ 1954-55 team finished 18-2, won league title, Sectionals & Intersectionals; averaged 14.9 ppg, named to Gazette All-County All-Star Team & runner-up to Lou Jordan as Sch'dy Player of Yr.
- ◆ Selected by Dell Magazine as one of the top 22 high school basketball players in NYS prior to 1955-56 season
- ◆ Rated as one of the top schoolboy players in the East prior to his senior season
- ◆ His senior team (1955-56) finished 18-1, won the Class "A" League, Sectional & Intersectional titles for 3rd consecutive year; Sch'dy Co-Player of the Year with teammate Ducky Castelle
- ◆ Held the NT single game scoring record (38 pts), later broken by AHOF member Murray Melton
- ◆ Received scholarship offers from Duke, NC State, Xavier, Army, Navy, Syracuse & others
- ◆ Averaged 16.3 ppg on the Syracuse frosh team
- ◆ SU varsity starter for 3 years (1957-60)
- ◆ Averaged 14.8 ppg as a senior at SU
- ◆ Once ranked 13th on S.U. career points list & is currently in the top 100 all-time S.U. scorers
- ◆ Taught physical education in the SCSD
- ◆ Entered the Marine Corps in 1962
- ◆ 3rd highest scorer in Okinawa Inter-Service Basketball League (First Team All-Star)
- ◆ Awarded a Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" Device for Valor (nation's 4th highest award) for participation in combat operation in Vietnam; earned several decorations; retired from the USMC with 20 years active service (rank of Major)
- ◆ Military instructor for USMC Junior ROTC for 23 years in Elizabeth, NJ

Dot Hoyt Nebel

- ◆ Graduated from the original Sch'dy HS in 1921
- ◆ Inducted into the U.S. Ski Hall of Fame in 1972; viewed as an important pioneer in the early history of women's skiing in the U.S.
- ◆ Started skiing in Central Park; self-taught downhill & slalom expert
- ◆ Teacher & ski club advisor at Sch'dy HS & MPHS; coached ski teams at MPHS & Union College
- ◆ Finished 3rd in both the downhill & combined at the 1938 Women's National Championships
- ◆ 1938 U.S. International Ski Federation team member; two 4th place finishes (Slalom II & Combined) vs. international competition in St. Moritz
- ◆ In 1938, she was the 1st American in one European event, 2nd American in 3 events, 3rd American once & 4th American four times
- ◆ Won prestigious races in 1939 on Mount Rainier, Mount Hood & Mount Baker
- ◆ Participated in Olympic Trials on Mount Hood & named to the 1940 U.S. Winter Olympic team (Olympics were cancelled due to World War II)
- ◆ Won downhill & slalom titles in 1940 & 1941 Eastern Skiing Championships, winning '40 downhill in record time
- ◆ Won downhill event in 1942 U.S. vs. Canada competition at Lake Placid
- ◆ Active in Schenectady Wintersports Club
- ◆ One of the first female ski school directors in U.S.
- ◆ Coach & instructor at Pico Peak; managed ski school at Gore Mountain; founder and first president of the NYS Professional Ski Instructors Association
- ◆ Designed original ski trail system at Belleayre Mountain; ran the ski school for 17 years; Belleayre dedicated a ski trail in her name; inducted into the Belleayre Mountain Hall of Fame in 2007
- ◆ Gov. George Pataki declared "Dot Nebel Day" (1/30/99) to recognize her accomplishments
- ◆ Along with Dr. Guy Suits & other Sch'dy engineers & scientists, conducted informal research & development project to optimize the design of metal edges on wooden skis; she was chief ski tester
- ◆ First coach of future Olympic gold medalist Andrea Mead, who touted her as "one of the sports' splendid pioneers...the person upon who we all built our talents" (Bill Rice, Gazette - 1/31/92)
